Kathleen C. Barclay currently serves as a Principal of Barclay & Halpern, international strategic advisors, focused on cross-border business opportunities between the United States and Chile and arising in Chile and extending elsewhere in the Americas.

She is a member of the Board of Directors of Bicecorp and Banco Bice. Additionally, Ms. Barclay is active in cultural and academic affairs including participation as a member of the Board of Trustees of the Pan-American Development Foundation (PADF), Advisory Board of the Centro de Estudios Públicos, a member of the Advisory Editorial committee of El Diario Financiero, a member of the Business Advisory Board to the Entrepreneurship and Innovation Center at the Universidad del Desarrollo, a member of the Advisory Board of the Universidad Adolfo Ibáñez (www.uai.cl), a member of the Global Advisory Board of Endeavor, Chairman of the Advisory Board of Endeavor-Chile, and a member of the board of the Instituto Chileno Norteamericano de Cultura. She is a member of the Council of the Americas and the US Chamber of Commerce. Additionally, she serves as a member of the Advisory Council to the Wildlife Conservation Society (WCS) for its Karukinka project in Chile.

Prior to 2001, Ms. Barclay had a 23-year career in J. P. Morgan Chase including assignments in New York, London and Santiago. She ran the Latin American Corporate Credit Area in the early 1980s, was Director of Investment Banking in London covering Latin American multinational advisory and capital markets from 1988-1992. From 1992 through 2000, Ms. Barclay was responsible for the Bank's business in Chile with an emphasis on cross-border transactions and investment banking services. As Senior Country Officer, she represented the firm on various boards of directors in representation of the Bank's private equity sister company. Under her direction the Bank obtained a top-three leadership position for international M&A, capital markets and syndicated loan transactions.

Ms. Barclay is Past President of the American Chamber of Commerce in Chile - AmCham Chile and a member of AmCham Chile's Board of Directors. She is editor of Business Chile, the country's only English language magazine. In October 2006 she was re-elected Chair of AACCLA (the Association of American Chambers of Commerce in Latin America). From 2003 through 2005 she served as AACCLA's Treasurer and member of its Executive Committee.

She has a B.S. in Foreign Service from Georgetown University in Washington, D.C.
