NEXT WORKSHOP FRIEDMAN HAYEK CENTER – DR. ALEJANDRO CORBACHO -HYBRID MODE

Naumann Chair- Visions for the Future of Democracy in the 21st Century

Expositor Prof. Dr. Alexander Görlach

Alexander Görlach is a senior fellow to the Carnegie Council for Ethics in International Affairs. Holding PhDs in comparative religion and linguistics his work focuses on the future of democracy, narratives of identity, and politics and religion. He was a visiting scholar and fellow to both, Harvard University in the US and Cambridge University in the UK. He is a research associate at the Internet Institute at Oxford University where he looks into new technologies and how they are used in democracies and abused in dictatorships. In the academic year 2017-18 Alexander Görlach was a visiting scholar to National Taiwan University and City University Hong Kong. Since then he focuses on the rise of fascist China and what it means for East Asia and the free world altogether. His book publications include "Homo Empathicus: On Scapegoats, Populists & Saving Democracy" (Brookings, 2021) and "Focus Hongkong: Why The Future of The Free World Will be Decided in China" (Hoffmann&Campe, 2020). Alexander Görlach is amongst others an op-ed contributor to the New York Times and Neue Zürcher Zeitung. He is a columnist for Deutsche Welle and Wirtschaftswoche, Germany's largest business outlet.
