NEXT SEMINAR FOR THE STUDY OF A FREE SOCIETY - DR. JULIO ELÍAS - ONLINE MODE

Today, Wednesday May 4, at 5 p.m. Dr. Julio Elías will present his research "Understanding Creativity: Innovators in Art, Literature and the Wine Industry of Argentina".

The Economics of Creativity is based on the idea that the main source of variation in the creative process throughout the life cycle is not explained by differences between the different disciplines (e.g. History versus Art), but is due to differences between innovators within a same discipline (e.g. Picasso Versus Cézanne). The objective of the seminar is to provide a basis for understanding the types of innovators within a same discipline analyzing the different patterns of creative production.

NEXT SEMINAR ON EDUCATIONAL FREEDOM – DR. MARTÍN KRAUSE – ONLINE MODE

On Thursday, May 12 at 12.30 p.m. Dr. Martín Krause will present the paper "La educación como bien público" (Education as a public good) in the cycle of seminars on Educational Freedom.

The issue of education as a "public good", has a more or less precise definition for economists. For the people, in general, a public good is that which is provided by the State, perhaps because it "benefits everyone". Economists speak of a "positive externality", that is to say, a benefit that everyone receives, whether or not they bear its cost. For that reason, the argument continues, the market would "fail" in providing it, at least in sufficient quantity, and the State must do so. There are two issues then, worth discussing: is formal education a "public good"? and, is it correct that the market cannot provide it?
