SEMINAR OF THE CYCLE HISTORY AND FREEDOM – PRESENTATION OF THE BOOK PAGAN LOS POBRES (THE POOR PAY) – DR. JUAN SEBASTIÁN LANDONI

On Wednesday, July 6 at 1 pm, Dr. Juan Sebastián Landoni, *fellow* of the Center, presented the book "Pagan los pobres" (The poor pay), written together with Luciano Villegas. The presentation of the book was in the History and Freedom Cycle, coordinated by Dr. Alejandro Gómez, who is also a researcher at the Friedman Hayek Center.

The Poor Pay does not reflect on the poverty of the ascetic, but thinks about the poverty of those who are trapped by a cultural, social, economic and political environment, that prevents them from getting out of a situation that they do not want. Public policy mistakes have negative consequences for many individuals and groups. But the burden of those mistakes ultimately falls on the poor, both old and new. Nevertheless, this is not a book against public policy but about the unintended consequences of well-intentioned public policies; those that benefit some groups but end up impoverishing the majority; that can generate some benefit in the short term, but impoverish in the long term.
