As with the extraordinary workshops by Dr. Deirdre McCloskey and Dr. Peter Boettke, this edition will be exclusively in **online** format. The access link is:

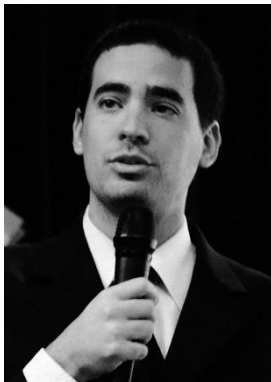

PRESENTATION OF BOOK – DR. ADRIÁN RAVIER

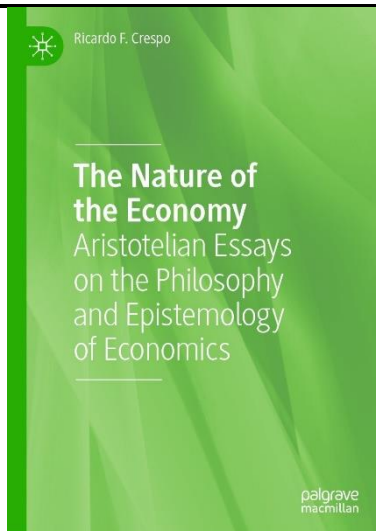

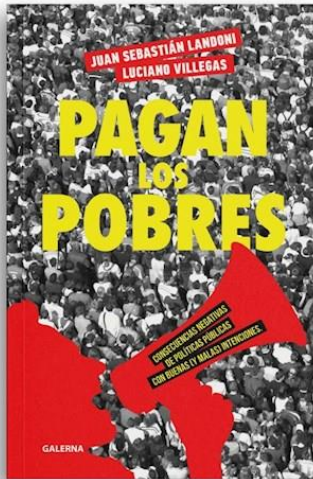

SEMINAR OF THE CYCLE HISTORY AND FREEDOM – PRESENTATION OF THE BOOK PAGAN LOS POBRES (THE POOR PAY) – DR. JUAN SEBASTIÁN LANDONI

On Wednesday, July 6 at 1 pm, Dr. Juan Sebastián Landoni, *fellow* of the Center, presented the book “Pagan los pobres” (The poor pay), written together with Luciano Villegas. The presentation of the book was in the History and Freedom Cycle, coordinated by Dr. Alejandro Gómez, who is also a researcher at the Friedman Hayek Center.

The Poor Pay does not reflect on the poverty of the ascetic, but thinks about the poverty of those who are trapped by a cultural, social, economic and political environment, that prevents them from getting out of a situation that they do not want. Public policy mistakes have negative consequences for many individuals and groups. But the burden of those mistakes ultimately falls on the poor, both old and new. Nevertheless, this is not a book against public policy but about the unintended consequences of well-intentioned public policies; those that benefit some groups but end up impoverishing the majority; that can generate some benefit in the short term, but impoverish in the long term.

NAUMANN CHAIR SEMINAR

Today at 10:30 am a new edition of the Naumann Chair took place, with the theme: Regulaciones en el ciberespacio: ¿cómo defender nuestros derechos en la web? (Regulations in cyberspace: how to defend our rights in the web?)

The speaker was Filipe Domingues. Born in Lisbon in 1985, he has a degree in Communication Sciences from the Universidad Nova de Lisboa and the Università Degli Studi di Torino, with postgraduate studies in Diplomacy and International Relations in the Universidad Lusíada de Lisboa. He is co-founder of the Center for Cooperation in Cyberspace, co-author of the biography of the Secretary-General of the United States, António Guterres, "Honest Broker" and Secretary-General of the Institute for the Promotion of Latin America and the Caribbean (IPDAL) in Portugal. He speaks five languages and is regularly invited to do analysis on Portuguese and international television, radio and press.

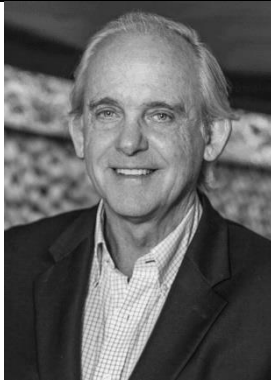
We will shortly be uploading the recording of this talk on UCEMA's YouTube channel, we recommend watching it to those interested in the subject.



PATHS OF FREEDOM COMPETITION

The Salinas Group issues a call for the 17th Paths of Freedom Essay Contest. Freedom is a fundamental human right but efforts to limit it have become systematic in the contemporary world. Many oppose freedom for the sake of so-called "collective rights", because they think that the end justifies the means. If individual freedom is limited, they argue, the community may obtain greater prosperity. However, historical experience points out, that respect for personal freedom is not only the only way to preserve human dignity, but also the most efficient way for building a more prosperous society. For this reason, and in view of the need to promote the discussion and circulation of information on the subject of freedom, Salinas Group has decided to call for the seventeenth Essay Contest "Paths of Freedom".
