We share below a few lines from the abstract of the event:</p> <p>The unprovoked Russian invasion of Ukraine, the continued rise of populist (and even authoritarian) leaders, a looming global recession, the heartfelt effects of climate change, and more and more protest movements rioting on the streets: With so many urgent issues, it seems hard to justify for liberals to go back to the drawing board. We think it is an important strategic task for liberals and this is exactly what this seminar is about: Taking a step back and bringing liberal intellectuals from all over the world together to reflect and update the foundations of the Open Society™—liberalism’s very own utopia. This is crucial, as the threats to liberalism have piled up over time without liberals really sprinting to action. With 17 (!) years of continuous democratic decline in the Freedom House Index, the dream of global liberalism is just about to slip away from our fingers. That is why it is high time to revitalize this project of the Open Society™.</p>
