COURSE ON THE ESSENTIALS OF LIBERALISM

Yesterday, Tuesday, September 19, the fifth class of the online course “Lo esencial del liberalismo” (The essentials of liberalism) was given by Dr. Alejandro Gómez, *fellow* of the Center, who gave a dissertation on the legacy of the French Revolution.

The course, whose teaching staff is also composed entirely by *fellows* of the Friedman Hayek Center, seeks to bring the main foundations of liberal thought closer to a mass audience. Yesterday's session was attended by more than 400 participants. There were more than 100 interventions by the audience and there has been a total registration of around 2500 people, mainly from Latin America, USA and Europe.

The course concludes on December 12 with a closing keynote lecture by Dr. Alberto Benegas Lynch (h.), *fellow* of the Center. With this new initiative, the Friedman Hayek Center reaffirms its mission and purpose in bringing liberal theory and praxis closer to large audiences.
